



On the first day, **Michael Hecht**, President and CEO of **Greater New Orleans Inc.**, gave an excellent talk on the overall Gulf Coast energy economy and the important riole the Deepwater Oil and Gas development plays in the regional economy. On Thursday **Kristen Ray**, General Manager for the GOM for **BHP Billiton**, provided a very informative presentation on *Creating and Delivering Value* in the current economic environment.



The symposium was concluded with its traditional plenary session, this year a Management Panel looking at **Creating and Delivering Value in a Low Price Environment**."

Training of Engineers

In my 62 years in the industry I have always been interested in teaching and training. Much of that schooling was with CE Natco in the boom years of the 60's and 70's when we were so short of engineers in that healthy growth period of the industry. It was a very successful effort, and many of those young people turned out as leaders in many phases of the petroleum industry.

I now find myself doing the same type teaching to an impressively bright and well educated group of young engineers. However, there is a difference, which will eventually have some bearing in the technical side of our industry. Today our young people in the operating companies and most particularly in the enlarged staffs of consulting firms lack almost all "hands on" exposure. This lack of experience is very evident at times in reviewing their work. Certainly It is not necessary to go back to the 1950's and spend nearly a year rough necking to gain knowledge as we did in those days. (It is still fun to tell people I rough necked on a steam powered drilling-barge.) The offshore industry needs to look at this problem.

When we did the training in the 60's and 70's the management of the operating companies was always willing to accept an extra young person on a project to give them experience. That does not appear to be the case today because of the increased cost of transportation and housing to reach operating platforms or floating facilities. To go along with those things the liability exposure is greatly increased. The industry is much larger and personal contact and friendship with the decision makers is also more difficult

The offshore industry should address this problem. Even just a week's training on a facility might upgrade future installations. An experienced field superintendent with a desire to upgrade the technical support, and with the patience and aptitude to teach, might generate an excellent payout for the industry on its investment in young people.


