The four-part multi-disciplinary competition asks students to design a future city by employing critical thinking, teamwork, research and problem-solving skills. Their solution is a city designed using SimCity software, a table-top scale city model built with recycled materials, a research essay on a specific engineering topic (this year "Age-Friendly Cities"), and a seven-minute team verbal presentation defending their vision before a panel of judges. Those of us in the workforce can appreciate the demands the students must face. Working with an engineer mentor and a teacher-sponsor, 12- to 14-year-old student minds tackle transportation, environmental, communication, water management, energy, housing, budgetary and other issues with vigor and innovation.

SPECIAL AWARDS SPONSORSHIP: With dozens of entries and hundreds of students competing, we need the special awards program to supplement the traditional 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place recognitions for both the middle school and elementary competitions. 
