John Lopez, Ph.D. Coast and Community Program Director Lake Pontchartrain Basin Foundation



Biography

John Lopez Ph.D. is the Coast and Community Program Director for the Lake Pontchartrain Basin Foundation which conducts coastal restoration and research. Born in New Orleans, he holds a Masters in Geology from the University of Southern California and a Ph.D. in Applied Science and Engineering from the University of New Orleans. From 2010 to 2014, he was Executive Director and oversaw the reconstruction of the New Canal Lighthouse. Previously, he worked for the Corps of Engineers in the Coastal Restoration Branch. He developed the Multiple Lines of Defense strategy for coastal Louisiana which has had gained broad acceptance in coastal Louisiana. From 2009 to the present, he has served on the State's Framework Development team to advise the State on the State Master Plan for 2012 and 2017. He is currently member of the Coastal Advisory Committee for the South Louisiana Flood Protection Authority-East, and Coastal Erosion Advisory Committee for the City of Mandeville. He also chairs the Pontchartrain-Maurepas Surge Consortium and the Breton-Borgne Surge Consortium.

We were honored to take part in this opportunity, allowing LSU to become the first U.S. university to partner with this program. Over 90 students were in attendance and became certified in this course. We loved learning from Mr. Phillipe Guys, former CEO and Managing Director of various Total Operations, and appreciated him traveling all the way from Europe to teach this course.

Industry Sessions

Our first meeting of the year took place in August with Chevron. Process Engineers from their Gulf of Mexico Business Unit came to speak to us about flow assurance in operations offshore. Following the meeting, we enjoyed networking at Caliente. We also welcomed Chesapeake Energy to campus for their information session. Their engineers gave us a great overview of the company and both their internship and new hire engineering developmental programs. We are excited to welcome more key energy players this semester and learn from other companies.

SAVE THE DATE......December 15, 2018. Plan to attend this year's FIRST LEGO League Championship tournament which will be held at Jesuit High School. The theme of this year's challenge is INTO ORBIT.

Middle-school students, ages 9 to 14, will participate in challenges pertaining to living in and traveling through space.

Each Challenge has three parts: the **Robot Game**, the **Project**, and the **Core Values**. Teams of up to ten children, with at least two adult coaches, participate in the Challenge by programming an autonomous robot to score points on a themed playing field (Robot Game), developing a solution to a problem they have identified (Project), all guided by the *FIRST* Core Values. Throughout their experience, teams operate under the *FIRST* signature set of Core Values, celebrating discovery, teamwork, and Gracious Professionalism[®].

FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) is a 501 C 3 non-profit entity that serves to engage students in cutting edge STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) activities to improve the overall education of our children. FIRST LEGO league programs are now impacting well over 1700 students each year.

We are looking for volunteers willing to dive-in and research this piece of


