Biography

From 2014 to 2016, Jim was GOMBU's Shelf Asset Development Manager and later General Manager for Shelf Assets. In these positions he managed multidisciplinary planning and execution of field developments and divestment portfolios across the Gulf of Mexico Shelf.

Jim began his career at Chevron in 1990 as a Development Geologist in Algiers, Louisiana. From 1992-2003, he held a variety of technical and management positions of increasing responsibility for Chevron's Gulf of Mexico Business Unit in New Orleans, Louisiana. In 2003, Jim and his family transferred to Luanda, Angola where he was the Tombua-Landana Asset Team Leader for Chevron's Southern Africa Strategic Business Unit. Returning to the United States in 2007, Jim became the Asset Development Manager for Chevron's Kern River Field in the San Joaquin Valley Business Unit located in Bakersfield, California. Jim was named the General Manager of Operational Excellence in 2010 reporting to the Corporate Vice President of Health, Environment, and Safety located in San Ramon, California. In that role, he oversaw implementation of Chevron's Operational Excellence Management System (OEMS), which is the framework for managing all health, environment, safety, reliability, and efficiency efforts to achieve world class performance. In 2012, Jim was named Principal Consultant-Strategy for Corporate Strategic Planning where he led the development of long-term world oil supply views and coordinated technology trends assessments for Chevron.

Jim graduated from the University of Nebraska in 1988 with a Bachelor of Science degree with Distinction in Geology and obtained his Master of Science in Geology from the University of Oklahoma in 1990. He is married to Shelli Swartz; they have three children.

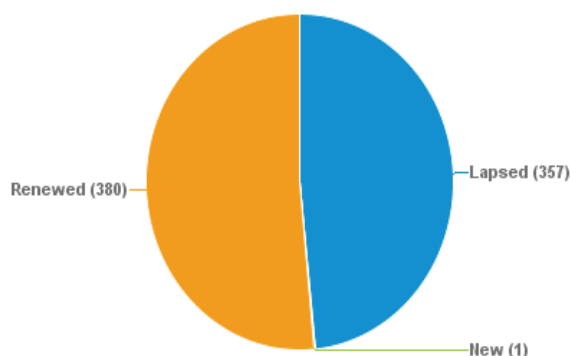

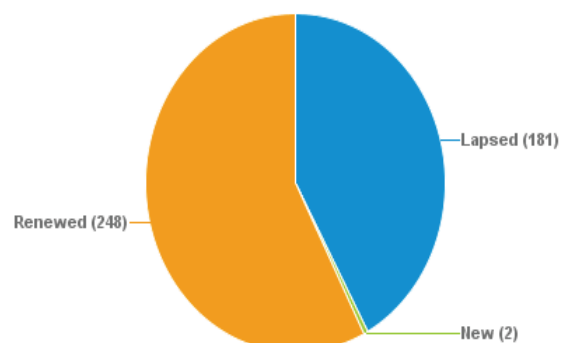

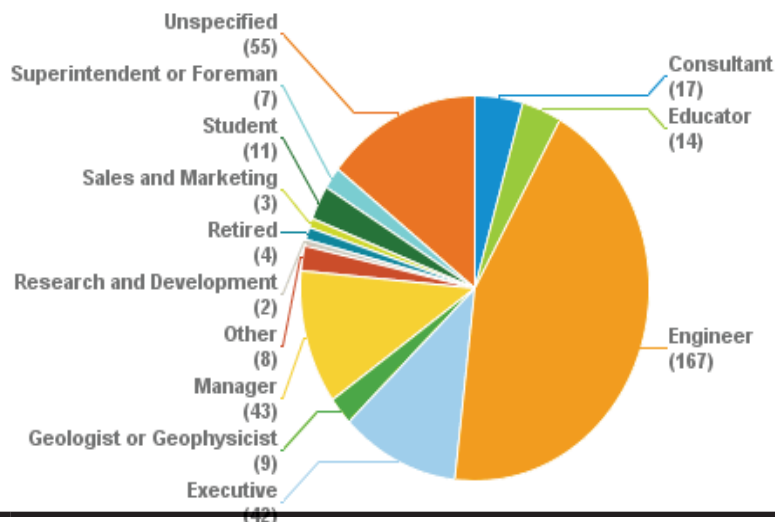

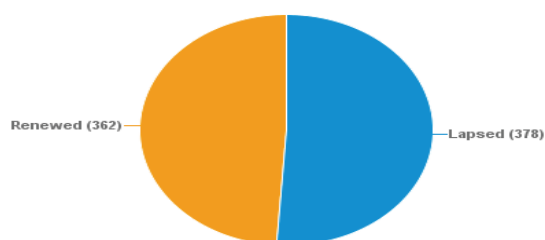

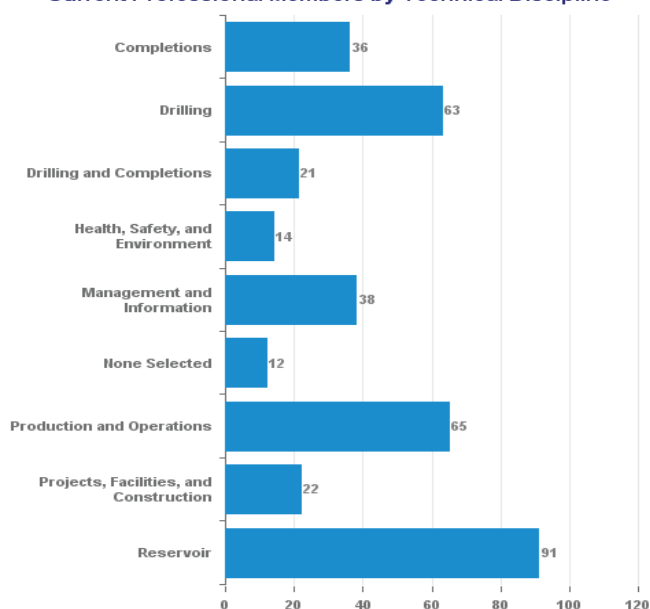

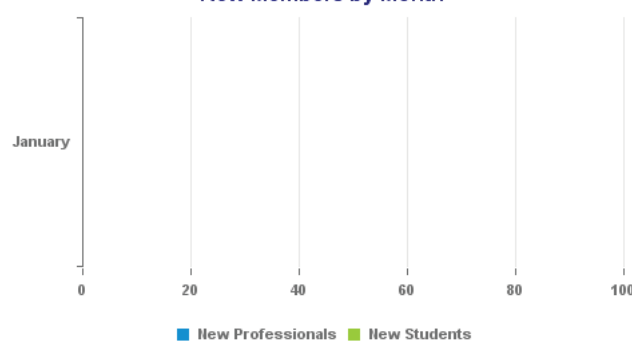
Total Members by Year



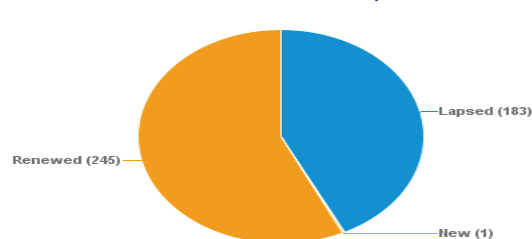
Current Professional Members by Technical Discipline



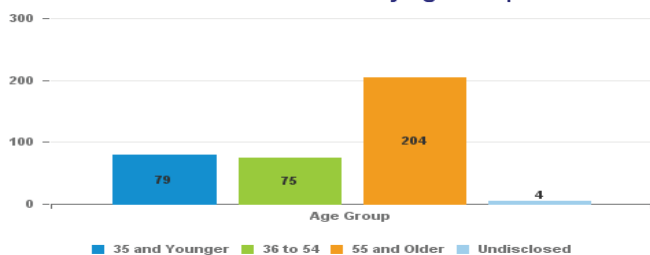
New Members by Month



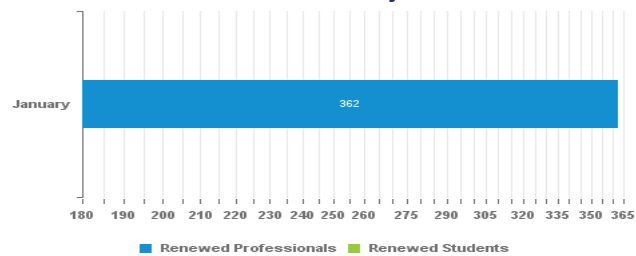

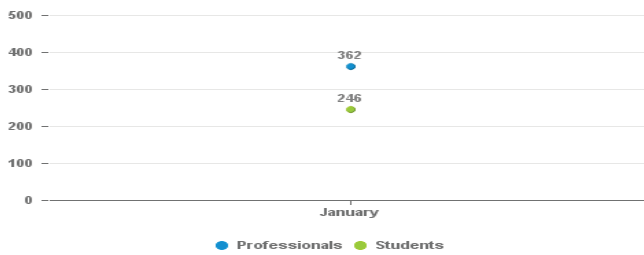
Professional Members by Age Group



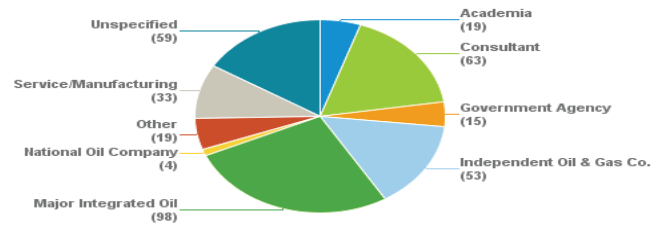
Renewed Members by Month



Current Members by Month

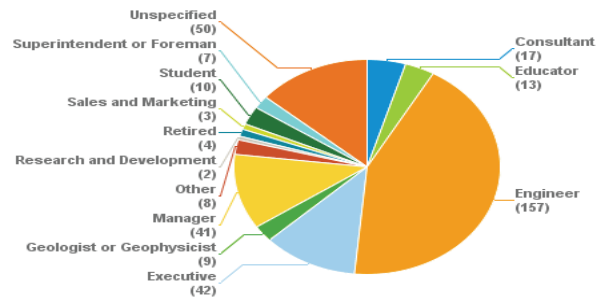

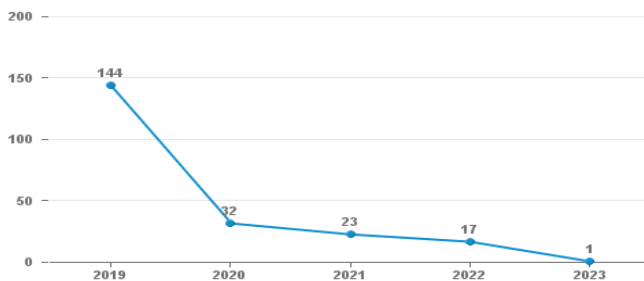

Professionals by Job Classification



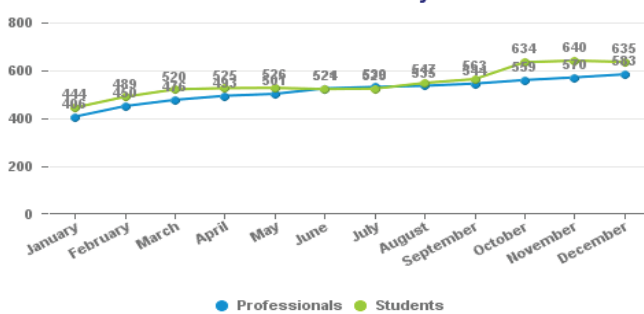

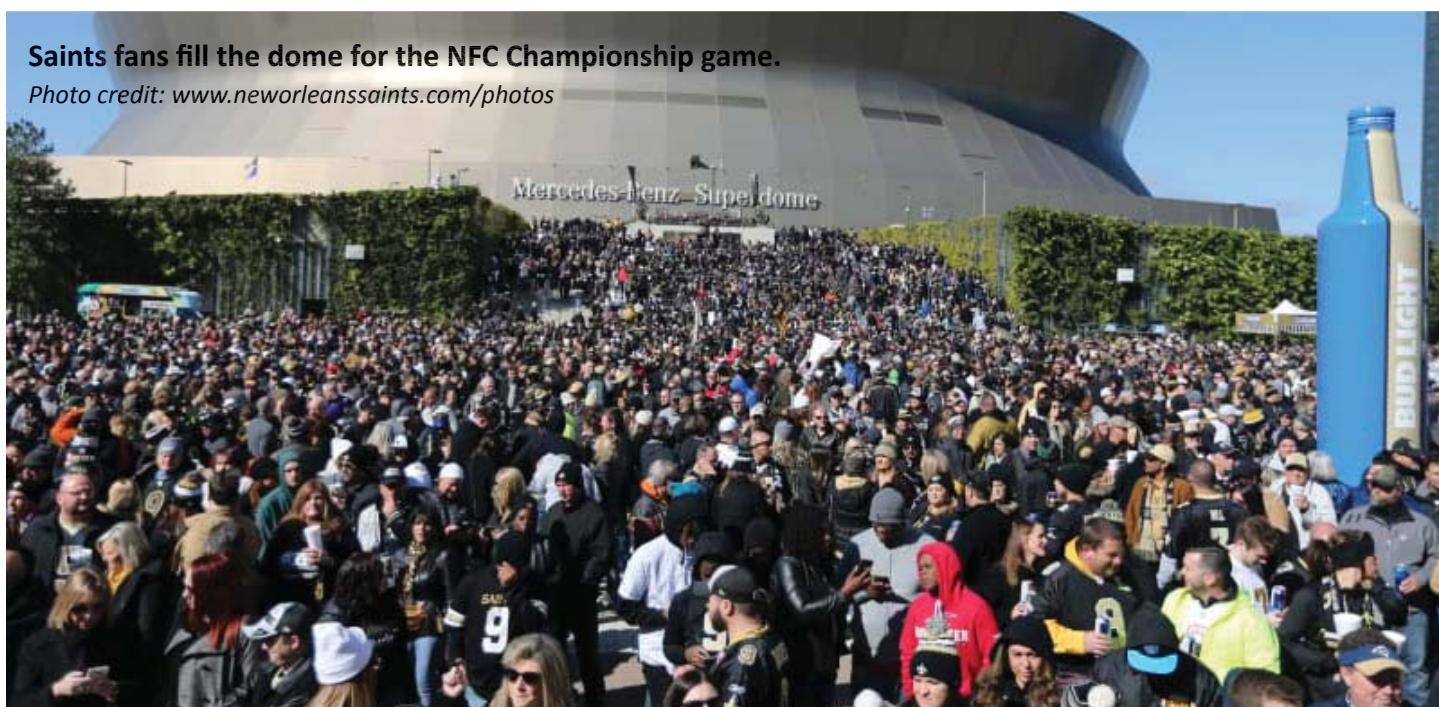

The National WWII Museum in New Orleans is a remarkable place. It contains snippets of oil's role in winning the war, but not much of that story.

Armies, navies, air forces consume vast quantities of resources. Oil - lots of it - was required to make the victory possible.

SPE Delta is launching a study to develop the story of fuel, oil in particular, in winning WWII.

We are looking for volunteers willing to dive-in and research this piece of history to tell the story of how much was needed, where it came from, how it was found, produced, refined,

conserved, transported, and fought over, how it affected military strategy and about the people who made it all happen.

We hope that eventually the story we develop will be presented in the National WWII Museum.

This is likely to be a multi-year effort. Our first goal will likely to be development of a short documentary video.

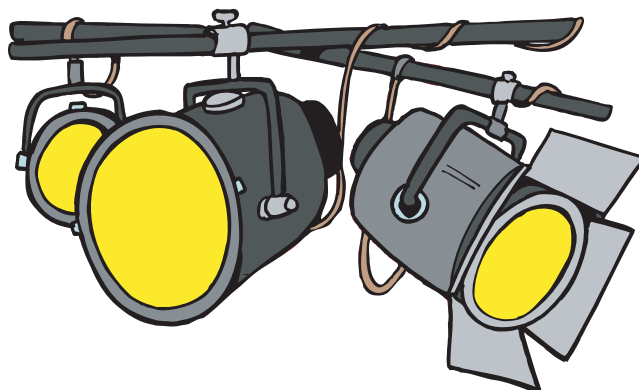
